### TITLE IX AND STUDENTS

Federal law, Title IX, State law and PazLo District Policy (APEX Academy and MATRIX for Success) prohibit anyone from discriminating against any student on the basis of actual or perceived sex, sexual orientation, and gender (including gender identity, gender expression, martial status, parenting, pregnancy, childbirth, false pregnancy or related medical condition)

Male and female students have the right to equal learning opportunities in their schools and must be treated the same in all PazLo District educational activities and programs, including:

- Athletics, Physical Education
- The classes students can take
- The way students are treated in the educational programs and activities
- The kind of counseling students are given
- The extracurricular activities, programs and clubs in which students can participate
- The honors, special awards, scholarships and graduation activities in which students can participate

Students who feel that their rights are being violated have the right to take action and are encouraged to resolve any situation by speaking to a school administrator, Title IX/Bullying Complaint Coordinator, Counselor, or trusted adult at the school, or filing a complaint. (see UNIFORM COMPLAINT PROCEDURES) Students are encouraged, whenever possible, to try to resolve their complaints directly at the school site. Any student who believes he/she is being discriminated against in violation of Title IX has the right to file a complaint.
